Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2018

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Part 1 Preliminary

1 Short title

This subordinate local law may be cited as *Mount Isa City Council* Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2018.

2 Purpose and how it is to be achieved

- (1) The purpose of this subordinate local law is to supplement *Local Law No. 2* (*Animal Management*) 2013, which provides for regulation of the keeping and control of animals within the local government's area.
- (2) The purpose is to be achieved by providing for—
 - (a) the circumstances in which the keeping of animals is prohibited or requires approval; and
 - (b) requirements for keeping animals, including minimum standards, mandatory desexing, proper enclosures, koala conservation and identification; and
 - (c) the control of animals in public places; and
 - (d) matters regarding the impounding of animals and the sale or disposal of impounded animals; and
 - (e) the conditions to be complied with by persons who offer animals, or a particular species of animals, for sale; and
 - (f) the declaration of a species of animal as a declared dangerous animal and the criteria for declaration of a specific animal as a declared dangerous animal.

3 Authorising local law

The making of the provisions in this subordinate local law is authorised by *Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2013* (the *authorising local law*).

4 Definitions

- (1) Particular words used in this subordinate local law have the same meaning as provided for in the authorising local law.
- (2) The dictionary in schedule 14 defines particular words used in this subordinate local law.

Part 2 Keeping of animals

5 Circumstances in which keeping animals prohibited-Authorising local law, s 5(1)

For section 5(1) of the authorising local law, keeping an animal or animals mentioned in column 1 of schedule 1 is prohibited in the circumstances described in column 2 of schedule 1.

6 Circumstances in which keeping animals requires approval-Authorising local law, s 6(1)

For section 6(1) of the authorising local law, keeping an animal or animals of the species or breed mentioned in column 1 of schedule 2 requires approval in the circumstances described in column 2 of schedule 2.

7 Animals that must be desexed-Authorising local law, s 7

For section 7 of the authorising local law, an animal of the species or breed mentioned in column 1 of schedule 3 must be desexed once it reaches the age specified in column 2 of schedule 3 except in the circumstances described in column 3 of schedule 3.

8 Minimum standards for keeping animals-Authorising local law, s 8(1)

- (1) For section 8(1) of the authorising local law, the minimum standards for the keeping of animals are set out in schedule 4.
- (2) For section 8(1) of the authorising local law, column 2 of schedule 5 sets out the minimum standards for keeping an animal of the species or breed mentioned in column 1 of schedule 5.

9 Identification for cats and dogs in certain circumstances-Authorising local law, s 9

For section 9 of the authorising local law, the identification required for a cat or dog that is at a place other than the address stated in the registration notice for the cat or dog is the registration device mentioned in section 12(3) of the *Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008*.

Part 3 Control of animals

10 Public places where animals are prohibited-Authorising local law, s 10(1)

For section 10(1) of the authorising local law, the species or breeds of animals mentioned in column 2 of schedule 6 are prohibited in the public places described in column 1 of schedule 6.

11 Dog off-leash areas-Authorising local law, s 11(1)

For section 11(1) of the authorising local law, the areas described in schedule 7 are designated as dog off-leash areas.

12 Animal faeces in public places-Authorising local law, s 13

For section 13 of the authorising local law, the following animals are prescribed as an animal whose faeces must be removed from a public place in an urban area and disposed of in a sanitary way –

- (a) a camel;
- (b) a cat;

- (c) a horse;
- (d) a dog;
- (e) a cow or bull;
- (f) a donkey;
- (g) a sheep;
- (h) a goat;

13 Requirements for proper enclosures for keeping animals-Authorising local law, s 14(2)

For section 14(2) of the authorising local law, column 2 of schedule 8, sets out the requirements for proper enclosures for an animal of the species or breed mentioned in column 1 of schedule 8.

14 Koala conservation-Authorising local law, s 15

- (1) For section 15(1) of the authorising local law, schedule 9 sets out the requirements for keeping a dog on land that is within a koala area.
- (2) For section 15(4) of the authorising local law, each area described in schedule 10 is designated as a koala area.

15 Criteria for declared dangerous animals-Authorising local law, s 19(1)

For section 19(1) of the authorising local law, the criteria for declaring an animal as a declared dangerous animal are set out in schedule 11.

Part 4 Seizure, impounding or destruction of animals

16 Place of care for impounded animals-Authorising local law, s 24

For section 24 of the authorising local law, the place of care for animals impounded by the local government will be operated by the local government or a contractor of the local government.

17 Animals that may be disposed of without auction or tender-Authorising local law, s 32(1)(b)

For section 32(1)(b) of the authorising local law, the species, breeds or classes of animal that may be sold by private agreement, destroyed or disposed of in some other way are the following—

- (a) dogs;
- (b) cats;
- (c) sheep;
- (d) goats;
- (e) poultry, including any species of fowl, duck, goose, pigeon, turkey, peafowl or guineafowl.
- (f) birds,

(g) other small domestic animals.

18 Register of impounded animals-Authorising local law, s 33(3)

For section 33(3) of the authorising local law, the register of impounded animals will be kept at the local government's public office.

Part 5 Miscellaneous

19 Conditions regarding sale of animals-Authorising local law, s 42(1)

For the purposes of section 42(1) of the authorising local law, persons who offer for sale an animal of a species or breed mentioned in column 1 of schedule 12 must comply with the conditions set out in column 2 of schedule 12.

20 Animals excluded from application of the local law-Authorising local law, schedule

For the purposes of the definition of "*animal*" in the schedule to the authorising local law, the following species of animal are excluded from the application of the authorising local law—

- (a) fish,
- (b) insects,
- (c) amphibians,
- (d) reptiles.

21 Species that are declared dangerous animals-Authorising local law, schedule

For the purposes of the definition of "*declared dangerous animal*" in the schedule to the authorising local law, no species is declared as a declared dangerous animal.

22 Prescribed period for reclaiming animals-Authorising local law, schedule

For the purposes of the definition of "*prescribed period*" in the schedule to the authorising local law, the period within which an animal may be reclaimed is —

- (a) if the animal is registered or micro-chipped with the local government-5 business days; or
- (b) if the animal is not registered or micro-chipped with the local government— 3 business days.

23 Repeal

This subordinate local law repeals Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2013.

A prohibition prescribed in this schedule does not apply to the keeping of an animal or

animals on premises if the animal or animals were kept on the premises before the commencement of the authorising local law and the keeping of the animal or animals did not contravene a provision of a pre-existing local law.

However, in the event of any of the approved animals becoming deceased or otherwise disposed of, the owner must make application for a replacement application nominating all animals that will be kept on the premises.

Schedule 4 Minimum standards for keeping animals generally

Section 8(1)

A person who keeps an animal on premises must-

- (a) ensure that waste waters from enclosures are drained in a nuisance free manner and that run-off is kept off adjoining land or as otherwise directed by an authorised person; and
- (b) ensure that excreta, food scraps, and other material that is, or is likely to become, offensive is collected at least once in each day and, if not immediately disposed of, is kept in a fly proof container of a kind approved by an authorised person; and
- (c) ensure that any enclosure in which the animal is kept is kept in a clean and sanitary condition and free from dust and odour; and
- (d) ensure that any enclosure in which the animal is kept is properly maintained in an aesthetically acceptable condition; and
- (e) ensure the animal does not makes a noise that constitutes a nuisance ("*animal noise nuisance*") in the reasonable opinion of an authorised person.

An animal causes an animal noise nuisance if it makes a noise that occurs more than once in a forty-eight (48) hour period which:

- (i) persists for more than five (5) minutes continually during any hour of any day or night; and
- (ii) disrupts or inhibits the reasonable enjoyment of an activity ordinarily carried out on adjoining or nearby residential premises.

Example —

The barking of a dog which disrupts a person—

- sleeping; or
- holding a conversation; or
- watching television; or
- listening to a radio or recorded material
- (f) ensure that the area available to the animal kept on the premises is appropriately sized so that the animal can be effectively and comfortably kept; and
- (g) any animal food is stored in an impervious fly proof and vermin proof receptacle or in an impervious fly proof and vermin proof storeroom facility and the receptacle or storeroom facility, as the case may be, is maintained to the satisfaction of an authorised person; and
- (h) ensure that all animals kept on the premises are provided with and have access to adequate shelter, drinking water and appropriate food; and
- (i) ensure that any enclosure used for the purpose of keeping an animal is thoroughly cleaned each week and effectively treated with an insecticide at least twice a year; and
- (j) comply with reasonable directions given by an authorised person to ensure that the keeping of the animal does not result in nuisance to occupiers of other land or premises; and

(k) upon discovering the existence of a dead animal, immediately dispose of the remains of the dead animal so as not to cause a nuisance. The remains must not be disposed of on or in a public place.



Schedule 11 Criteria for declared dangerous animals

Section 15

- (1) A dangerous animal declaration may be made for an animal if the animal
 - (a) has seriously attacked, or acted in a way that caused fear to, a person or another animal; or
 - (b) there is a high likelihood of the animal causing injury to a person or animal; or
 - (c) damage to property, taking into account -
 - (i) its prior history of attacking or causing fear to persons or animals or
 - (ii) damaging property; or
 - (iii) the extent of injury or damage that could potentially be inflicted by an animal of its size and species or breed; or
 - (iv) the authorised person's first-hand assessment of the animal has indicated that the animal has demonstrated aggressive tendencies; or
 - (vi) a high level of concern about the danger posed by the animal has been expressed by neighbours or other persons who have come into contact with the animal.
- (2) Within 2 days of the declaration of a dangerous animal, there must be displayed at any entrance to the premises where the animal resides to be viewed by persons entering such premises, a sign which prominently and permanently displays in lettering not less than 50 millimetres in height on a background so as to be readily legible the following words—





Section 4

adjoining premise means a premise that is situated next to another that share the same boundary

allotment means a single parcel of land, or several contiguous parcels of land in the same ownership or occupation.

Animal Management Act see Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008.

assistance dog means a dog trained to perform identifiable physical tasks and behaviors to assist a person with a disability to reduce the person's need for support. (*The Guide, Hearing and Assistance Dogs Act 2000* refers)

building has the meaning given in the Building Act 1975.

Camooweal Urban Area means the area shown as the Camooweal Urban Area in Schedule 14.

Cat —

- (a) has the meaning given in section 11 of the Animal Management Act; and
- (b) includes a kitten regardless of age.

cattle means any bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer or calf.

destroy, an animal, includes causing it to be destroyed.

dog —

- (a) has the meaning given in section 11 of the Animal Management Act; and
- (b) includes a puppy regardless of age.

domestic kitchen – relating to or used in the home or everyday life within a household

domestic purposes means the purposes of —

- (a) human consumption; or
- (b) food preparation; or
- (c) washing; or
- (d) other normal domestic duties.

dwelling – means a house or other building or place in which somebody lives

horse includes a pony and a miniature horse.

keep (an animal) —

- (a) includes board, breed and train; and
- (b) in the absence of evidence to the contrary, a person is presumed to keep an animal on land if the person
 - (i) feeds and cares for the animal on the land; and

(ii) the animal is observed by an authorised person on the land on more than 1 occasion during a month.

land has the meaning given in the Planning Act 2016.

livestock means alpacas, buffalo, camel, deer, emus, goats, horses, ostriches, pig, poultry or sheep.

Mount Isa Urban Area means the area shown as the Mount Isa Urban Area in Schedule 14.

Mount Isa Urban Fringe Area means the area shown as the Mount Isa Urban Fringe Area in Schedule 14.

multi-residential premises includes each of the following -

- (a) a residence which forms part of a group of 2 or more residences in circumstances where 2 or more of the residences of the group are directly adjacent to each other and share
 - (i) a common wall; or
 - (ii) a ceiling in circumstances where 1 residence is directly under the floor of another residence; and
- (b) a residence situated on a lot which forms part of a community titles scheme as defined in the *Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997.*

Examples of multi-residential premises: Flats, boarding houses, tenement buildings, home units, townhouses and duplexes.

occupier, of premises —

- (a) means the person who has the control or management of the premises; and
- (b) includes the owner of the premises where there is no person in apparent occupation of the premises.

planning scheme has the meaning given in the Planning Act 2016.

premises—

- (a) means any land, building or structure and includes any part thereof; and
- (b) includes an allotment, whether or not
 - (i) the allotment is a single parcel of land, or several contiguous parcels of land; or
 - (ii) all of the contiguous parcels of land are in
 - (A) the same ownership; or
 - (B) the same occupation; and
- (c) includes multi-residential premises.

primary producer has the meaning given in the Animal Management (Cat and Dogs) Act 2008.

property boundary means the boundary line between two properties, also referred to as property line

public place means a place or part of a place —

- (a) that the public is entitled to use, is open to members of the public or is used by the public, whether or not on payment of money (a beach, park or road, for example); or
- (b) if the occupier of the place allows members of the public to enter the place, whether or not on payment of money (a sale yard or showground, for example).

racehorse means a horse that is registered with Racing Australia as a racehorse.

Racehorse Stable Precinct means the area depicted as a racehorse stable precinct within the Mount Isa Urban Area.

registered has the meaning given in the Animal Management Act.

residence means a building, or part of a building, that is ---

- (a) fixed to land; and
- (b) designed, or approved by a local government, for human habitation by a single family unit; and
- (c) used for residential purposes.

residential area —

- (a) means premises zoned in the planning scheme of the local government as suitable for use as residential premises; and
- (b) includes any premises (contiguous premises) if the premises
 - (i) are contiguous to premises identified in paragraph (a), regardless of whether the contiguous premises are zoned as suitable for use as residential premises or not; and
 - (ii) have an area not more than 4,000m2.

residential premises means premises used, or intended to be used, predominantly as a place of residence.

rural land has the meaning given in the Animal Management Act.

security/guard dog means a dog which is contained at commercial premises without a handler, which in the opinion of an authorized person is used for the purpose of acting as a deterrent to intruders.

stock has the meaning given in the Animal Management Act.

structure has the meaning given in the Local Government Act 2009.

watercourse means -

- (a) a canal, creek, river or stream in which water flows permanently or intermittently; or
- (b) an ocean, a lake or other collection of water (whether permanent or intermittent)

working dog has the meaning given in the Animal Management Act.
