#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

On 17 June 2022 Council received a referral notice from the Office of the Independent Assessor (OIA) advising that Council was to deal with a complaint of alleged inappropriate conduct by Councillor Phillip Barwick. In accordance with resolution SM25/06/22 Council engaged an external investigator to investigate the complaint and an investigation report has been completed.

#### RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council note receipt of the Councillor Complaint Investigation Report

#### AND

**THAT** Council note the findings of this report that Cr Phillip Barwick has engaged in inappropriate conduct as defined under section 150K(1) of the *Local Government Act 2009* on two occasions when referring to the Mayor's behaviour as erratic and reckless on his Facebook page.

# **AND**

**THAT** pursuant to Section 150AH(1)(a) of the *Local Government Act 2009* Council makes an Order that no further action be taken

#### **BACKGROUND**

On 17 June 2022 Council received a referral notice from the OIA advising that Council was to deal with a complaint regarding alleged inappropriate conduct by Councillor Phillip Barwick. In accordance with the *Local Government Act 2009* and the Councillor Investigation Policy, Council is required to deal with the complaint.

Council resolved at its' 29 June 2022 Special Meeting: That Council engage an independent contractor to undertake the investigation, in a manner that is consistent with the Mount Isa City Council Investigation Policy.

#### **OVERVIEW**

An investigation into the allegations outlined by the OIA was undertaken to establish if Councillor Phillip Barwick breached the Code of Conduct for Councillors when he posted comments on social media Facebook on 24 May 2022 relating to an article in the North West Star about "the mayor's refusal to back the budget she helped develop". An Investigation Report is provided to Council for its consideration. The Executive Summary of this report is as follows:

The Investigator has interviewed and considered the responses of the Complainant and the Subject Councillor and has reviewed the relevant provisions of the Local Government Act 2009, Council's

Code of Conduct for Councillors Policy, Council's Councillor Investigation Policy and the Referral Notice and attachments from the OIA.

The Investigator has broken the complaint down into five components:

- Untrue public comment on the budget timelines
- · Referring to the Mayor as erratic
- · Referring to the Mayor as manipulative
- Referring to the Mayor as antagonistic
- · Referring to the Mayor as reckless

and found that two of the complaint components, referring to the Mayor's behaviour as reckless and erratic, have been proven and three of the components unsubstantiated.

Council's Code of Conduct for Councillors requires Councillors to treat fellow Councillors in a respectful way with courtesy, honesty and fairness. Referring to the Mayor's behaviour as reckless and erratic does not meet the behavioural requirements of this Code.

The Investigator reasonably believes the context within which Cr Barwick made the comments about the Mayor's behaviour needs to be considered in determining what action the Council should take in dealing with Cr Barwick's breach of the Act.

Council's Code of Conduct for Councillors also requires the conduct of Councillors to not reflect adversely on the reputation of Council and for Councillors to respect the democratic process and maintain and strengthen the public's trust and confidence in the integrity of Council.

It is clear in evidence that Cr Barwick, as Deputy Mayor, was concerned about the reputational damage to the Council and to the individual Councillors following public comments by the Mayor that the Councillors had lost touch with their community. Cr Barwick, in his posts to his Facebook page in response to posts from members of the public, was intent on correcting what he considered to be disrespectful and damaging comments made by the Mayor about the budget process and about the Councillors.

Given the context referred to above around the behaviour of both the Mayor and Cr Barwick and given Cr Barwick has admitted to his comments and that he has no prior breaches of the Act, the recommendation below proposes Council note the breach and take no further action.

The Mount Isa City Council's Councillor Investigation Policy (the Investigation Policy) requires this Report with the below recommendations be considered in an open meeting of Council subject to the health and safety of the complainant

- (vii) an order that the councillor reimburse the local government for all or some of the costs arising from the councillor's inappropriate conduct.

Dear Chief Executive Officer,

As you may be aware, each year in accordance with the *Holidays Act 1983* local governments are invited to request special holidays to be observed during the following year for districts in their area.

If you wish to request special holidays to be observed during 2023 for districts in your local government area, please complete the attached request form and submit via email to <a href="mailto:info@oir.qld.gov.au">info@oir.qld.gov.au</a> by no later than **Friday**, **29 July 2022**.

A local council requested special holiday is a public holiday only if it is in respect of an agricultural, horticultural or industrial show. Under federal industrial relations legislation, on a public holiday employees are, without loss of ordinary pay, entitled to be absent from work or refuse to work in reasonable circumstances. Employees who work on a public holiday are entitled to penalty rates in accordance with their award or agreement.

A special holiday for any other reason is not a public holiday but is a bank holiday only and under the *Trading (Allowable Hours) Act 1990*, is only a holiday for banks and insurance offices and under a directive of the *Public Service Act 2008*, a holiday for public service employees unless otherwise determined by a chief executive.

Upon receiving Ministerial approval, the holidays will be published in the Queensland Government Gazette. Confirmation of the approved special holidays together with a link to the Queensland Government Gazette will be emailed to your office.

# 12.1 AWARD OF - RFT 2022-68 MOUNT ISA CITY STREETS REHAB AND RESEAL STAGE 2 TO FULTON HOGAN

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Mount Isa City Council is responsible for the ongoing maintenance of local government roads. Council has been approved \$1,009,518 funding under the Federal Governments Roads to Recovery program to assist in delivering this maintenance. Council have recently tendered for the rehabilitation and reseal of approximately 30,549m<sup>2</sup> of roads.

#### RECOMMENDATION

**THAT** Council award Contract 2022-68 to Fulton Hogan Industries for the Mount Isa City Streets rehabilitation and reseal 2022-2023 program for the value of \$1,170,763.35 (excl. GST).

#### **OVERVIEW**

Council have been approved funding to rehabilitate and reseal the roads listed in the table below through the Roads to Recovery (R2R) 2022-2023 program.

The Roads to Recovery 2021-2022 program is being delivery at present by Fulton Hogan Industries. Council invited a single tender through Local Buy to Fulton Hogan Industries for the 2022-23 program under the provisions of the Local Government Regulations 2012 section 235 (f).

Fulton Hogan have provided a detailed cost breakdown for the above works totalling \$1,170,763.35 (excl.GST). The cost of mobilisation has significantly reduced from the previous

contract. Fulton Hogan have confirmed that they will be able to continue on from 2021-22 program into the 2022-23 program.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Fulton Hogan Industries are currently in Mount Isa undertaking the Mount Isa City Streets Rehabilitation and Reseal Contract 2022-07. This contract comprises 28,000m<sup>2</sup> of pulverisation to a depth of 175mm, reprofiling, recompaction and sealing, delivering the 2021-22 Roads to Recovery (R2R) program.

Historically Council has undertaken reseal programs only. This has proven to not be the best value for money as the reseals only have a 2-year lifespan due to moisture entering the pavements preceding the reseals and failures not being rectified. As a result, the pavement will continue cracking and subsiding after the reseal and will eventually fail. The pulverisation and re-compaction process then sealing with a more durable 2-coat seal design allows for the rectification of the cracking and subsidence of the pavement which leads to a 10-to-20-year lifespan. Fulton Hogan specialise in this process.

Council will deliver the R2R funding program fully this financial year by engaging contractors early prior to the unpredictable wet season.

#### **BUDGET AND RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS**

Council has been awarded \$1,009,518 under the federal governments Road to Recovery Program.

Council's approved 2022-23 capital budget includes \$1,000,000 for rehabilitation of roads and \$1,100,000 for Street/Road Rehabilitation R2R.

Engaging Fulton Hogan Industries to carry on from 2021-2022 to 2022-2023 program has significantly reduced the cost of mobilisation under the second contract.
