

FOR CAT & DOG OWNERS

THE LAWS REGARDING CATS OR DOGS IN QUEENSLAND ARE CHANGING.

Due to recent changes in legislation, all councils across Queensland must implement the new Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008 by the 12th of December 2010.

There are some significant changes to your responsibilities as an animal owner as a result of the new legislation, and the Mount Isa City Council provides the following information to assist in your understanding of the new act (with respect to microchipping and registration).

MICROCHIPPING YOUR PET

There are three cases where microchipping your cat or dog is **mandatory**:

- If your cat or dog is under 3 years of age as of the 12th December 2010 If
- your cat or dog is being sold or given away
- If your dog is a declared regulated dog.

It is recommended that all pets be microchipped, regardless of their age, to assist in reuniting them with their owners should they become lost. However, if your pet is older than 12 weeks (and is not to be sold / given away, or declared regulated) you are not required to have them microchipped.

REGISTRATION & MICROCHIPPING OBLIGATIONS

The following table should help outline some of the changes (and your responsibilities).
